

Five-year Summary of Acreage and Production with September WASDE





Previous 10-year history


Reduced harvested area pulls rice production down 14% Y-O-Y

U.S. Rice Planted Acreage


Acreage in 2021 was 2.532 million vs. acreage in 2022 of 2.220 million

Trends in Arkansas rice plantings from 2000 to 2022





Projected prices \$16.50 per cwt for LG and \$17.00 per cwt for south. MG rice



November 2022 contract performance as of September 15, 2022





Milled exports projected to continue declining while RR projected to increase





Decreasing trend over the previous five-years






Mexico slashes paddy rice tariff in efforts to diversify suppliers






On May 16th, the Mexican government announced an effort to combat food price inflation with the elimination of import duties on a range of commodities for one year, including paddy rice.



Iraq Rice Imports


Historically purchased rice from Western Hemisphere and Asian suppliers





Weekly FOB Long Grain Rice Export Price Quotes








Global Rice Stocks and Exporter Stocks

Global stocks lower; global exports up (India remains the top exporter)








India and Thailand Rice Exports

India's exports to decline while Thailand's export up 8% for 2023








India's Rice Exports
